A Number of Issues concern my family in relation to the application, these being as follows. A hoarding/temporary fencing has been erected along Gays lane, which breaches the site boundary. and comes into the public road, which is preventing delivery vehicles from accessing my house/site, and that of my neighbour. When I was given planning permission to develop /rebuild ...one of the conditions was that the lane was to be left in a natural state, and that due to the narrowness of the lane, due care and attention was to be made to minimise inconvienience to other road users (your Informatives on approved application 11/00442/FUL) .....We, at present. cannot get large vehicles down the lane!!, and this is becoming a major inconvienience, when trying to construct a property. All the vegetation behind the hoardings(some of which is actually part of Gavs lane) has been cut down and cleared!!...when the hoarding is removed...is there going to be a big gap in the 'natural state of the lane'.....I think so!!, and what of the trees and animals?? As a neighbour who is trying to construct his property in accordance with the requirements laid down by Rochford council, and my own concerns for green/environmental issues, I am a little disappointed that the developer has been given the ok to damage the lane like this!
