picture 1. Boat traversing the Ashingdon Road straddling the median this happens on a semi regular basis and I am told plans to expand Baltic Wharf will mean there will be more boat movements which have no choice but to use the Ashingdon Road.

picture 2 nowhere for the removal lorry to pull off road

picture 3 lorry too high to pass under the bridge at Hall Road, so had to turn round causing a 40 minute congestion

picture 4 Rectory Road bridge flooded and vehicle stranded and damaged.

Picture 6 roadworks cause congestion on a regular basis. They have no choice but to park two wheels on the pavement which reduces the size of the pedestrian walkway and at the same time causes congestion on this too narrow road.

picture 7 Oxford Road too narrow for the size and amount of vehicles it will be a catastrophe should emergency services need access.

picture 8 Van parked off road Ashingdon Road on the pavement this is a regular occurrence.
